### TAGUIG SAFE CITY TASK FORCE

ADVISORY NO. 04

**TO : ALL RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF TAGUIG**

**RE : Guidelines on the Establishment of Safe Zones in All Residential Areas in the City of Taguig, for use by all residents including children and the elderly, during the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ)**

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To properly implement the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines of the Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) found in IATF Resolution No. 37, as well as the provisions of Taguig City Executive Order No. 7, Series of 2020, the Taguig Safe City Task Force hereby implements the following rules and guidelines for the establishment, designation, inspection and approval of safe zones in all residential areas in the City:

1. Safe Zones are identified common areas that are highly regulated by the local government, such as open spaces, gardens, parks, walkways, multi-purpose courts, and other similar areas that is reserved for use by all residents, particularly senior citizens and children. All pools, gyms, playgrounds and other leisure areas shall, however, remain closed;
2. Safe Zones shall be identified and established within the premises of residential areas, such as condominiums, villages and subdivisions, as well as within the jurisdiction of all barangays for the use of all its residents;
3. Designated Safe Zones shall only be allowed to open upon inspection and clearance by the Taguig Safe City Task Force (Task Force) or its duly authorized representatives. Applications for inspection and clearance for designated Safe Zones shall be made through [taguiginfo.com/safe-city](http://taguiginfo.com/safe-city);
4. During the inspection of the proposed Safe Zones, the applicant, or his duly authorized representative, shall conduct a walk-thru of the area, showing the measures taken and the protocols in place to ensure that social distancing and other minimum public health standards are complied with and strictly enforced within the said Safe Zone (i.e. provision of alcohol or sanitizer and regular disinfecting schedule);
5. Once a designated Safe Zone is allowed to open, the requesting barangay official, homeowner's association president, property manager or administrator is tasked, by themselves or their duly appointed "Safe Zone Administrator," to limit, regulate and monitor the use of these areas;
6. Safe Zones may be open from 5:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. The Safe Zone Administrator shall designate a particular time slot everyday for the exclusive use of senior citizens. He or she shall likewise ensure that face masks are worn at all times, social distancing is strictly observed, and the Safe Zone is not used for eating, loitering or any social gatherings;

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7. All residents shall be allowed to use the designated Safe Zone. Children aged twelve (12) years and below must be accompanied by one (1) adult. Only one (1) child with one (1) adult per household shall be allowed at a time. Mingling and playing with neighbors and other children is prohibited;
8. In compliance with the advice of our City Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance Unit (CEDSU), individuals exercising within the Safe Zone must maintain a distance of at least five (5) meters from other individuals. Group exercise or workout sessions in designated Safe Zones are strictly prohibited;
9. Walking of dogs and other domestic pets are allowed in Safe Zones, provided that pet owners wear face masks all the time and social distancing is strictly observed. Pet owners may also walk their pets while biking, walking, jogging, or running, following the guidelines on Outdoor Exercise provided in Taguig Safe City Task Force Advisory No. 1 dated 15 May 2020;
10. The Safe Zone Administrator must conduct body temperature checks upon individuals prior to their entry to the Safe Zone. He or she must likewise maintain a log book or a system of registering users which must contain the latter's name, age, address, and time of entry and exit. These logbooks shall be shared with the Taguig Safe City Task Force or the CEDSU when the need arises;
11. All designated Safe Zones must have CCTV cameras, and footages from those cameras must be made available to the City when the need arises;

Any person in violation of these guidelines shall be penalized in accordance with Republic Act No. 11469, otherwise known as the "Bayanihan We Heal As One Act," Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the "Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act" in relation to Presidential Proclamation No. 922, and other applicable laws and ordinances. This will be without prejudice to the filing of an administrative case if the violator is a government official or employee.
