CLARIFICATIONS ON CERTAIN ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESSES ALLOWED TO OPERATE DURING THE GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE STARTING 19 AUGUST 2020

In accordance with the Transition Protocols in Metro Manila of the National Task Force Against COVID-19 (NTF), we seek to clarify to all Taguigeños and its stakeholders certain activities during the General Community Quarantine starting 19 August 2020:

1. MANDATORY WEARING OF FACE MASKS AND FACE SHIELDS

Face shields, apart from face masks, are required to be worn inside all modes of public transportation, in indoor workplaces, and in all commercial places.

2. MASS GATHERINGS

All mass gatherings, including religious activities, shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) persons in accordance with Section 4 (12) of the IATF-EID Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines with Amendments as of 16 July 2020.

3. BARBERSHOPS AND SALONS

In accordance with DTI Memorandum Circular 20-38, Series of 2020, Salons and Barbershops are allowed to operate at fifty percent (50%) operating capacity. They are allowed to offer all hair, nail, and skin care services, except full body massage, but subject to further strict protocols on hand sanitation, face mask and face shields, gloves, and sterilized equipment.

All other establishments offering personal care services or aesthetic procedures are not allowed to operate.

4. DINE-IN OPERATIONS

All restaurants and fastfood establishments are allowed to resume dine-in operations at thirty percent (30%) operational and seating capacity, subject to their compliance to the Mandatory Minimum Requirements for Operation of Dine-In Services of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) in DTI Memorandum Circular No. 20-39, Series of 2020.

5. MOTORCYCLE BACK RIDING

According to the NTF on motorcycle backriding, if both riders are living in the same house, there is no need for a motorcycle barrier. For riders not living in the same house, the DOTr-approved design barrier must be used.

The backrider must be an Authorized Person Outside Residence (APOR), while the driver may or may not be an APOR. The motorcycle must be privately owned and not for hire, and both riders must wear face masks and full-face helmets at all times.

The following guidelines are subject to change, and shall remain in force and effect until duly revoked, repealed or amended in an official issuance of the Taguig Safe City Task Force, the IATF-EID, or any relevant national government agency or office.
