TAGUIG SAFE CITY TASK FORCE ADVISORY NO. 18

TO : ALL RESIDENTS, EMPLOYEES, EMPLOYERS AND OWNERS OF BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS, OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICES, AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS OF THE CITY OF TAGUIG

RE: Guidelines on Certain Activities during the General Community Quarantine (GCQ) in the City of Taguig

In accordance with the pronouncement of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte on 17 August 2020 and the Inter-Agency Task Force for the management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) Resolution No. 64, placing the National Capital Region and other high risk areas under General Community Quarantine (GCQ) effective August 19, 2020 until August 31, 2020, the IATF-EID Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines with Amendments as of July 16, 2020 (IATF Omnibus Guidelines), and the other advisories issued by the Taguig Safe City Task Force (Safe City Task Force), the following guidelines shall be followed:

1. GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE

The GCQ refers to the transition phase after the fourteen (14) day time-out call for Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine for our medical frontliners and before the Modified General Community Quarantine. It is the implementation of temporary measures limiting the movement of transportation, regulation of operating industries, and presence of uniformed personnel to enforce community quarantine protocols.

2. ALLOWED ACTIVITIES

Movement of all residents shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, and for work in permitted offices or establishments or such other activities attached hereto. Movement for leisure purposes shall not be allowed.

3. TAGUIG UNIFIED QUARANTINE PASS

The Unified Quarantine Pass (UQP) is temporarily suspended. The strict use of the UQP will only be activated in areas where a Localized Community Quarantine is declared.

The UQP may also be activated to regulate and minimize congestion in high volume and high contact areas such as Public Markets, Supermarkets, Groceries and other similar areas, subject to the rules and guidelines to be implemented by the Safe City Task Force.

We urge all households to continue to limit movement to acquiring essential goods and services, and as much as possible, designate only one (1) person to go out of their home.

4. MINIMUM PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS

Even during GCQ, all sectors shall abide by the minimum health standards prescribed by the DOH in Administrative Order No. 2020-0015, the DOLE and DTI in Joint Memorandum Circular No. 20-04 Series 2020, as well as sector-relevant guidelines issued by the national government, its offices and attached agencies, as well as the guidelines issued by the City.

A. Strict Implementation and Enforcement of Health Protocols

Everyone is reminded to follow the three (3) basic protocols in order to curb the spread and protect yourselves from COVID-19:

- i. Wear a face mask;
- ii. Wash your hands; and,
- iii. Watch your distance.

All barangays, law enforcement offices and agencies, as well as private companies and organizations, are enjoined to strictly enforce these basic health protocols within your areas of jurisdiction at all times.

B. Use of Face Shields

In accordance with Joint Memorandum Circular No. 20-04 Series of 2020 of the DTI and DOLE and the Safe City Task Force Bulletin No. 2, the following rules on the use of face shields are required to be observed:

- i. All employees are required to wear a full face shield as part of the minimum health standard in the workplace.
- ii. All passengers availing of public transportation and private shuttle services must wear face shields.

5. CURFEW

The IATF Omnibus Guidelines provides that LGUs can enforce curfew to **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.

Thus, dispensable travels and mobility for **non-workers** shall be restricted from **8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.**

6. BELOW 21 YEARS OLD, THOSE WITH COMORBIDITIES, HEALTH RISKS, PREGNANT WOMEN, AND SENIOR CITIZENS

Any person below twenty-one (21) years old and sixty (60) years old and above shall be required to remain in their residences at all times, except for the following:

- A. obtaining essential goods and services, including access to malls to obtain such goods and services;
- B. going to and returning from work in offices or industries permitted to operate;
- C. outdoor exercise; and
- D. other permitted activities as prescribed in IATF resolutions.

7. SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS

- A. Submission of the Infectious Disease Preparedness and Response Plan (IDPRP), otherwise known as the Safe City Checklist.

In accordance of Executive Order No. 7, all business establishments operating within the City of Taguig must submit their respective IDPRP otherwise known as the Safe City Checklist. The form may be found at: <https://safecity.taguiginfo.com/downloadable-forms>.

- B. Appointment of Designated Safety Officer (DSO)

In accordance with Safe City Task Force Advisory No. 15 and Joint Memorandum Circular No. 20-04 Series of 2020 of the DTI and DOLE, all public and private establishments, including residential establishments, must have at least one (1) Designated Safety Officer, who shall be present in the premises at all times. The DSO is in-charge of:

- i. Ensuring that all health protocols are being implemented within their premises; and,
- ii. Coordinating and reporting COVID-19 cases thru the Emergency Response for Notifiable Infectious and Emerging Diseases (ERNIE) Unit or in case of business establishments, the Business Emergency Response for Notifiable Infectious and Emerging Diseases (BERNIE)

Residents of residential establishments such as condominiums, villages and subdivisions must coordinate reporting of COVID-19 cases with the DSO of their respective building administrators or homeowners associations.

- C. Mandatory Reporting

In accordance with Republic Act No. 11332 otherwise known as the “Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act”, and Safe City Advisory No. 15, all public and private offices, agencies, organizations, companies and all other

business establishments, should report COVID-19 cases to the following BERNIE numbers:

8. OUTDOOR EXERCISE

- A. All individuals are allowed to go out to exercise, provided they can observe a social distance of five (5) meters.
- B. Face masks must be worn at all times.
- C. Since small children require the close supervision of their parents or guardians and cannot be expected to follow social distancing protocols, the City Government has mandated barangay captains, purok or area leaders, and heads of homeowners' associations to designate Safe Zones in all barangays and private residential establishments for the use of their residents.
- D. Outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise, such as walking, jogging, running, swimming, playing golf, tennis, badminton, equestrian, range shooting, skateboarding within the City are allowed under GCQ.
- E. Outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise are also allowed for:
 - i. Senior Citizens;
 - ii. Those who are below twenty-one (21) years old;
 - iii. Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, other health risks;
 - iv. Pregnant women; and
 - v. Those that reside with the above.
- F. Operations of clubhouses or similar establishments shall be limited to basic operations. Restaurants and cafes therein are allowed to operate at thirty percent (30%) capacity, provided social distancing and protocols issued by the DTI for dine-in establishments are complied with.
- G. Spectators in all non-contact sports and exercises shall be prohibited.
- H. All swimming pools will be allowed to open, but shall be highly regulated and monitored by the property management and administrators.
- I. The City, through the Safe City Task Force, barangay officials, building or property managers or any of its authorized representatives, and our police authorities shall strictly implement the safety protocols prescribed by the IATF, DOH, as well as the advisories issued by the City. Any violators shall be apprehended and may be subject to other appropriate actions.

9. PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS STILL NOT ALLOWED TO OPERATE

In accordance with the pronouncements of the IATF-EID, the following businesses are still not allowed to operate at this time:

- A. Gyms, fitness centers and sports facilities;
- B. Drive-in cinemas;
- C. Tutorial and review centers;
- D. Internet cafes;
- E. Establishments offering personal grooming and aesthetic services; and,
- F. Pet grooming services.

These establishments shall temporary remain closed and shall resume only once allowed by the IATF-EID.

10. SAFE ZONES AND COMMON SPACES

- A. Public and private common spaces like plazas, parks, walkways and clubhouses can now be opened subject to the strict implementation of the safety protocols prescribed by the IATF, DOH, as well as the advisories issued by the City.
- B. Playgrounds, basketball courts and other places of leisure will still remain closed pursuant to the IATF Omnibus Guidelines
- C. Barangays are now tasked to monitor and implement the strict guidelines for all public parks, plazas, while, homeowners associations and building administrators will monitor and implement those located in their respective subdivisions and condominiums.
- D. All individuals, who are allowed to go out for activities mentioned above, may use the common spaces in public and private areas in Taguig. However, priority to use these facilities shall be given to senior citizens, children, pregnant women, and those with comorbidities.
- E. The Barangays, Homeowners associations and building administrators are highly encouraged to declare common areas as safe zones and appoint safe zone administrators to oversee these common areas.
- F. Safe Zones are highly regulated areas where the health and safety of its users are closely monitored. Safe Zones are now defined as a specific area and/or specific time in common areas that will be for the exclusive use of Senior Citizens, children, pregnant women and those with comorbidities.
- G. The City Government highly encourages all residents of Taguig to utilize these spaces for their own safety. However, loitering, mingling and congregating is still strictly prohibited.
- H. Law enforcement units are hereby advised to proceed in accordance with these guidelines.

11. CONSTRUCTION

The provisions in Safe City Task Force Advisory No. 10 shall be applicable to all public and private construction projects. To wit:

- A. Prior to resuming operations, all public and private construction projects must comply with the Construction Safety Guidelines issued by the Infrastructure Cluster and Local Building Official.

- B. Construction projects such as minor renovations and fit-outs do not need to apply for clearance or permits but must still observe the minimum health and safety standards imposed by the Department of Health.

All construction companies or contractors who have been granted a notice or clearance to proceed prior to the declaration of the MECQ last August 4, 2020 need not apply for a clearance again and may immediately resume construction operations.

12. TRANSPORTATION AND PRIVATE SHUTTLE SERVICES

The provisions of Safe City Advisory No. 11 shall be applicable and are hereby adopted.

A. Use of Motorcycles, Bicycles, including Electronic Bikes

- i. Individuals reporting to work, or those allowed to go out of their homes to purchase essential supplies and/or goods shall be allowed to use motorcycles and bicycles, including e-Bikes, as their means of transportation.
- ii. Back riders are allowed provided they utilize a barrier.
- iii. In addition to face masks, all drivers or riders must wear helmets and other protective gear.

B. Private Shuttle Services

In addition to the minimum safety protocols mentioned in Safe City Advisory No. 17, the following must be observed:

- i. Employers classified as large and medium-sized private establishments (i.e. those with total assets above PHP15M) are enjoined to provide shuttle services to their employees.
- ii. Minimum public health standards should be enforced in the shuttle services, i.e. use of face shields and face masks, observance of physical distancing, and frequent disinfection. Employees inside the vehicles should be required to avoid talking with each other, taking phone calls, eating, and removing their masks and shields. Signages of “No Talking,” “No Eating,” and “No Taking Phone Calls” should likewise be displayed or posted on the conspicuous areas in the vehicle.
- iii. All vehicle types, as long as not expressly prohibited by the DOTr through an issuance, may be used for shuttle services.
- iv. Adequate ventilation must be ensured at all by the opening of windows, with at least three (3) inches of opening, while in transit should be practiced whenever possible. The observance of physical distancing of at least one (1) meter and wearing of face masks and face shields shall be followed. Proper disinfection before and after each use of the vehicle is likewise mandatory.

- v. The following are not allowed to avail of the shuttle service unless when indispensable under the circumstances for work in permitted industries or offices:
 - 1. Any person below twenty one (21) years old;
 - 2. Any person who is sixty (60) years old and above;
 - 3. Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, or other health risks; and
 - 4. Pregnant women.

13. MALLS

- A. Limited operations in malls and shopping centers shall be allowed, except for leisure establishments and services which shall continue to be closed;
- B. Establishments and services allowed to operate in malls and shopping centers may only operate at a capacity consistent with the attached matrix;
- C. Those below twenty-one (21) years old, and those sixty (60) years old and above and those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women, including any person who resides with the aforementioned, may not enter malls and shopping centers except when indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services or for work in establishments located therein.

14. DINE-IN ESTABLISHMENTS

In accordance with the Safe City Advisory No. 14, Paragraph (C) of DTI's Minimum Health Protocols for Dine-in Restaurants and Fastfood Establishments, as adopted in IATF Resolution No. 45, all eating establishments shall be allowed to operate at thirty percent (30%) operational capacity, subject to the installation the following equipment and systems at their respective stores or areas:

- "C. Installing the following equipment and system at the workplace:
 - 1. Properly-sanitized tables and chairs (after each customer's use);
 - 2. Distancing of tables and chairs to at least one (1) meter apart on all sides;
 - 3. Face to face seating allowed only with proper dividers;
 - 4. Visible floor markings for guidance of clients in queueing, preferably color-coded;
 - 5. Proper ventilation in the establishment;
 - 6. Visibility and accessibility of sanitizing equipment and tools;
 - 7. Provision of food menus per table;
 - 8. Contactless order-taking;
 - 9. Cover pieces of furniture of porous materials in plastic for ease of sanitation;
 - 10. Personal effects of personnel in plastic bags and stored in an area inaccessible to clients;

11. Clean trash bins for used papers and used tissue;
12. Clean washrooms and toilets with sufficient soap, water and tissue and toilet paper;
13. Disinfection of high risk areas such as order and bar counters, every 30 minutes.”

Any person in violation of these guidelines shall be penalized in accordance with Republic Act No. 11469, otherwise known as the “Bayanihan We Heal As One Act,” Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the “Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act” in relation to Presidential Proclamation No. 922, and other applicable laws and ordinances. This will be without prejudice to the filing of an administrative case if the violator is a government official or employee.

GENERAL GUIDELINES APPLICABLE TO GCQ FOR THE CITY OF TAGUIG

1. Minimum health standards shall be complied with at all times
2. Movement of all residents shall be limited to accessing essential goods and services, and for work in permitted offices and establishments or such activities listed
3. Movement of cargo shall be unhampered
 - Cargo vehicles as well as vehicles used by public utility companies, BPOs, and export-oriented establishments shall not be subject to an ID system
4. The following shall be required to remain in their residences at all times:
 - Any person below 21 years old
 - Any person 60 years old and above
 - Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks
 - Pregnant women
 - Any person who resides with the aforementioned

Except:

 - i. Indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services;
 - ii. For work in industries and offices;
 - iii. Accessing Safe Zones; and
 - iv. Such other permitted activities like exercise
5. LGUs to enforce curfew only for **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.
 - Dispensable travels and mobility for **non-workers** shall be restricted from 8:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
6. All persons are mandated to wear face masks, earloop masks, indigenous, reusable, do-it-yourself masks, or face shields, handkerchiefs, bandanas, N95 masks, or such other protective equipment or any combination thereof, that can be worn over both the nose and mouth which can effectively lessen the transmission of COVID-19.
 - These masks must be worn whenever they go out of their residences for any purpose including travel to work, purchase of basic necessities, attending to medical or emergency reasons, or as part of one's work.



➤ These masks must be worn at all times and may not be removed.

7. Supermarkets, public and private wet markets, grocery stores, agri-fishery supply stores, veterinary supply stores, pharmacies, drug stores, and all other retail establishments engaged in the business of selling essential goods are strongly encouraged to extend their store operations to a maximum of 12 hours.
8. Acts of discrimination inflicted upon healthcare workers, repatriated OFWs and non-OFWs, COVID-19 cases, whether confirmed, recovered, or undergoing treatment, as well as suspect and probable cases, and PUM are denounced in the strongest terms.
 - Acts in furtherance of discrimination such as, but not limited to, coercion, libel, slander, physical injuries, and dishonor of contractual obligations, such as contracts of lease or employment, shall be dealt with criminally, civilly, and/or administratively.
9. All Malls are required to observe the minimum health standards laid out by the National Government and Local Government
