

PENALTIES FOR FAILURE TO FOLLOW HEALTH AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS

As per Taguig Safe City Task Force

Advisory No. 22 and in accordance with City Ordinance No. 24, otherwise known as the “New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City”



Failure to follow the proper health and safety protocols set by the IATF and the City Government of Taguig shall be fined accordingly:

Not Wearing Face Mask	P 1,000	4 hours (1 day)
Not Observing Social Distancing	P 1,000	4 hours (1 day)
Unauthorized Mass Gathering	P 1,000	4 hours (1 day)
Loitering in Violation of Quarantine Rules	P 1,000	4 hours (1 day)
Failure to Report Notifiable Diseases or Health Events of Public Concern	P 3,000	12 hours (3 days)
Failure to Cooperate of Persons or Entities Identified as having a Notifiable Disease or Health Events of Public Concern	P 3,000	12 hours (3 days)
Discriminating Health workers, Frontliners, OFWs, Repatriated Workers, COVID-19 Cases whether Suspect, Probable or Confirmed	P 5,000	20 hours (5 days)
Unauthorized Operation or Resumption of Business Activities Ordered Closed During a Public Health Emergency	P 5,000	20 hours (5 days)
Failure to Implement Health Protocols and Safety Measures	P 5,000	20 hours (5 days)

The administrative imposable fines cited above are without prejudice to the filing of a case in any court of competent jurisdiction in accordance with the provisions of the City Ordinance and other relevant national laws.

Any person, who after prosecution is convicted by the court for violation of any of the provisions of the New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City, shall be imposed a penalty of fine of not exceeding **Five Thousand (PHP5,000.00) Pesos**, or imprisonment of not exceeding six (6) months or both, at the discretion of the Court.

This is without prejudice to the filing of the necessary administrative case if the violator is a government employee or official.

If the violation is committed by a company or establishment, the President, Chairman, General Manager or any person entrusted with the administration of their affairs at the time of violation shall be held liable.
