ADVISORY NO. 27

TO: ALL DESIGNATED SAFETY OFFICERS, BARANGAY CAPTAINS, LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, AND OTHER CONCERNED INDIVIDUALS

RE: REMINDERS ON THE OBSERVANCE OF THE MINIMUM HEALTH STANDARDS AND SAFETY PROTOCOLS AS WE GRADUALLY REOPEN THE ECONOMY

Pursuant to Inter-Agency Task Force on Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) Resolution No. 76, in relation to the gradual reopening of the economy in increments proportional to the healthcare capacity of the country, all government officials and individuals charged with the enforcement of safety protocols and measures within their areas of responsibility are reminded to strictly enforce the following guidelines and protocols to be followed during the duration of the community quarantine:

1. GOING OUT OF HOMES MUST BE FOR AN ESSENTIAL PURPOSE

If the reason for going out of your homes is not essential or absolutely necessary, the public is advised to stay home. While businesses are being allowed to open gradually, the movement of people for leisure purposes is still not allowed, and vulnerable individuals such as those under twenty one (21) years old, sixty (60) years old and above, pregnant women, or those with comorbidities are still at risk of contracting the virus.

2. FACE MASKS AND FACE SHIELDS MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES

Any person outside of their homes must wear a face mask. Individuals not wearing a face mask must be reminded to wear one or sent home to get a face mask.

Face shields, apart from face masks, are required to be worn inside all modes of public transportation, in indoor workplaces, and in all commercial places. All establishments must strictly implement the "No Face Mask, No Face Shield, No Entry" Policy, and disallow entry to any individual who refuses to comply.

3. MASS AND SOCIAL GATHERINGS ARE STILL LIMITED

Except for religious activities that are allowed at ten percent (10%) venue capacity, all mass gatherings are still limited to ten (10) individuals. Gatherings for social, leisure or other unauthorized purposes are still prohibited at this time.

4. SUSPECT, PROBABLE AND CONFIRMED COVID-19 CASES MUST BE REPORTED TO THE TAGUIG CITY COVID-19 HOTLINE

In accordance with both the national law and the city ordinance on mandatory reporting of cases, all cases of suspect, probable or confirmed COVID-19 cases are required to be reported to the local health authorities. The City has put in place protocols to be followed, and are well-equipped to handle any COVID-19 related situation, with due consideration to the patient's privacy.

5. ALL ESTABLISHMENTS MUST HAVE A DESIGNATED SAFETY OFFICER

In accordance the New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City, all business establishments, regardless of size or type, must have at least one (1) Designated Safety Officer (DSO) at their stall, store, office, warehouse or their premises at all times.

The DSO **does not need to have** a Basic Occupational Safety and Health (BOSH) training or accreditation, **nor** need to be a medical practitioner. He or she just needs to:

(a) know the Taguig City COVID-19 hotline, and

(b) enforce the minimum health standards in the workplace.

6. ENCOURAGE THE PUBLIC TO REPORT VIOLATIONS OF MINIMUM HEALTH STANDARDS AND PROTOCOLS TO THE TAGUIG SAFE CITY TASK FORCE

Any person who is aware of any violation of the regulations, guidelines or protocols promulgated by the IATF-EID or the City Government, is encouraged to immediately report the matter to the Taguig Safe City Task Force thru the following:

The report must indicate important details, including where, when, and what violation was committed.

Any person in violation of these guidelines shall be penalized in accordance with Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the "Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act" in relation to Presidential Proclamation No. 922, City Ordinance No. 24, Series of 2020, otherwise

known as the “New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City” and other applicable laws and ordinances. This will be without prejudice to the filing of an administrative case if the violator is a government official or employee.
