TAGUIG SAFE CITY TASK FORCE ADVISORY NO. 50

TO: ALL RESIDENTS, EMPLOYEES, EMPLOYERS AND OWNERS OF BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS, OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF GOVERNMENT OFFICES, AND OTHER STAKEHOLDERS OF THE CITY OF TAGUIG

RE: Updated Guidelines on Certain Activities during the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) in the City of Taguig

In accordance with Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) Resolution No. 134, and the announcement of Presidential Spokesperson, Sec. Harry Roque, regarding the implementation of the Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) in the National Capital Region (NCR) from 21 August 2021 to 31 August 2021, the following guidelines shall be followed:

1. MODIFIED ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MECQ)

This MECQ under the IATF Resolution No. 134 refers to the transition phase from ECQ to MECQ, when the following temporary measures are relaxed and become less necessary: stringent limits on movement and transportation of people, strict regulation of operating industries, provision of food and essential services, and heightened presence of uniformed personnel to enforce community quarantine protocols.

2. STRICT IMPLEMENTATION OF MINIMUM PUBLIC HEALTH STANDARDS

All individuals shall abide by the minimum health standards prescribed by the Department of Health (DOH), as well as sector-relevant guidelines issued by the national government, its offices and attached agencies, as well as guidelines issued by the City, to wit:

- a. Wearing of face masks and face shields;
- b. Washing of hands;
- c. Observing social distance;
- d. Conducting daily health checks; and,
- e. Reporting individuals with symptoms or those who tested positive to COVID-19 to the Taguig COVID Hotline.

3. ALLOWED ACTIVITIES

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In accordance with IATF Resolution No. 134 and Section 3 of the IATF Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines, the movement of all persons shall be limited to the following:

- a. Obtaining access to essential goods and services. However, only one (1) member per household may be allowed to go out for this purpose;
- b. Going to and returning from work in offices, establishments or industries allowed to operate;
- c. Individual outdoor exercise, *provided* they do so within their barangay or vicinity; and,
- d. Going to their confirmed schedule of vaccination at any vaccination hubs and centers in the City.

4. PROHIBITED ESTABLISHMENTS AND ACTIVITIES

In accordance with Section 3(5) of the IATF Omnibus Guidelines, as amended last 19 August 2021, subject to the relevant issuances of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), the following establishments, persons, or activities shall not be permitted to operate, work, or be undertaken during MECQ:

- a. Entertainment venues with live performers such as karaoke bars, bars, clubs, concert halls, theaters, and cinemas;
- b. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys, and similar venues;
- c. Amusement parks or theme parks, fairs/peryas, kid amusement industries such as playgrounds, playroom and kiddie rides;
- d. Outdoor sports courts or venues for contact sports, scrimmages, games, or activities;
- e. Indoor sports courts or venues, fitness studios, gyms, spas or other indoor leisure centers or facilities;
- f. Casinos, horse racing, cockfighting and operation of cockpits, lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments except for the draws conducted by the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office;

- g. Indoor visitor or tourist attractions, libraries, archives, museums, galleries, and cultural shows and exhibits;
- h. Outdoor tourist attractions;
- i. Venues for meetings, incentives, conferences, and exhibitions;
- j. Personal care services which include beauty salons, beauty parlors, medical aesthetic clinics, cosmetic or derma clinics, make-up salons, nail spas, reflexology, aesthetics, wellness and holistic centers, and other similar establishments; acupuncture and electrocautery establishments, and massage therapy including sports therapy establishments. It also includes establishments providing tanning services, body piercings, tattooing and similar services. Home service for these activities are likewise not permitted; and,
- k. Indoor and outdoor or *al fresco* dining services of food preparation establishments such as commissaries, restaurants, and eateries.

For a specific list of business allowed to operate during MECQ, please see the attached matrix (Annex "A").

5. CURFEW

In accordance with Taguig City Executive Order No. 21, Series of 2021, the curfew or city-wide regulation on dispensable travels and mobility within the City of Taguig against the spread of COVID-19 **starting on 06 August 2021 until 31 August 2021** shall be restricted from **8:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m.**

The Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine amended last 03 April 2021 provides that that Local Government Units can enforce curfew to **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.

6. THE T.R.A.C.E. QR CODE

For purposes of going out of their homes for acquiring essential goods or services or other allowed essential purposes, Taguig residents are required to use the City's Taguig Registry for Access and City Engagement (T.R.A.C.E) for acquiring their individual QR codes used for assessment of their respective health status and as an easy access pass to all establishments in Taguig without compromising contact tracing.

Those who do not have their TRACE QR Code, must register by logging in to <https://trace.taguig.gov.ph> or by downloading the TRACE Taguig Mobile Application.

All barangays, law enforcement offices and agencies, as well as private companies and organizations, are enjoined to strictly enforce these basic health protocols within your areas of jurisdiction at all times.

7. VACCINATION DURING MECQ

Individuals on their way to their scheduled vaccination at any vaccination center or hub in Taguig are exempted from curfew during MECQ. The vaccinees must be able to show the following:

- a. For individuals scheduled to receive their 1st dose, the electronic ticket containing their confirmed schedule and a valid ID.
- b. For group bookings, the SMS from TAGUIGINFO and a valid ID.
- c. For those scheduled to receive their 2nd dose, their duly-issued vaccination card containing the details of their 1st dose, schedule of their 2nd dose and a valid ID.

8. MASS GATHERINGS

The following rules on Mass Gatherings shall apply, until further amended by the IATF or other relevant national government office or agency:

- a. Indoor or household gatherings with any person outside the immediate household are prohibited at this time;
- b. Gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 shall be allowed but only for immediate family members;
- c. Religious gatherings such as holy mass, church service, prayer meetings and other similar forms of gatherings are only allowed online or virtually; and
- d. Gatherings for essential government activities for the delivery of critical services or assistance shall be allowed, subject to the prior approval of the Safe City Task Force. Such gatherings will be strictly monitored and highly regulated.

9. OUTDOOR EXERCISE

In accordance with IATF Omnibus Guidelines, the following guidelines for Outdoor Exercise shall apply:

- a. Outdoor exercise must be done within the vicinity of their residence, village or Barangay only. Companions and spectators are not allowed.
- b. Though difficult, face masks must be worn at all times;
- c. All individuals allowed to go out to exercise must observe a social distance of five (5) meters;
- d. Outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of exercise are also allowed for the following, provided they strictly follow minimum health protocols:
 - i. Senior Citizens;
 - ii. Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, other health risks; and,
 - iii. Pregnant women;
 - iv. Those that reside with the above mentioned.
- e. Swimming pools in private residential establishments will be allowed to open for individual outdoor exercise, but shall be highly regulated and monitored by the property management and administrators.
- f. All Designated Safety Officers, PNP, the TMD Teams, and barangay officials in charge of peace and order are reminded to strictly implement the protocols abovementioned for the safety and well-being of all residents.

10. DESIGNATED SAFE ZONES

In accordance with the previous issuances of the Safe City Task Force, Safe Zones are highly regulated areas where the health and safety of its users are closely monitored.

- a. All Safe Zones in private communities previously approved by the Safe City Task Force may be used during MECQ.
- b. Priority of use for these facilities shall be given to senior citizens, children, pregnant women, and those with comorbidities;
- c. Minors are allowed to engage in individual outdoor exercise in designated Safe Zones, *provided* they are accompanied by a parent or adult guardian, and only one (1) minor child in the family goes out at a time, *provided further*, that they strictly observe all minimum health protocols;
- d. Playgrounds, basketball courts and other places of leisure will still remain closed pursuant to the IATF Omnibus Guidelines;

- e. The City Government highly encourages all residents of Taguig to utilize these spaces for their own safety. However, loitering, mingling and congregating is still strictly prohibited;
- f. Safe Zone administrators are reminded to strictly enforce minimum public health standards within their respective areas and ask anyone who fails to comply to leave immediately and stay home.

11. TRANSPORTATION AND PRIVATE SHUTTLE SERVICES

In accordance with the Omnibus Guidelines on Public Transportation of the Department of Transportation (DOTr), as well as the relevant issuances of the Safe City Task Force, the following guidelines on public and private transportation shall apply:

a. Common Safety Protocols

- i. The “No Face Mask, No Face Shield, No Ride” Policy shall be strictly enforced in all modes of public transportation or employee shuttle service, except that face shields shall not be required for motorcycle taxis. Passengers and drivers who willfully disregard this policy must be refused entry or prohibited from operating any public utility vehicle (PUV);
- ii. The following are not allowed to ride any public utility vehicle, except when procuring essential needs, going to work in permitted industries or offices, or medical emergencies:
 - (1) Any person below eighteen (18) or above sixty-five (65) years old;
 - (2) Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities, or other health risks; and,
 - (3) Pregnant women.
- iii. Passengers in any type of PUV or employee shuttle service must be seated at least one (1) seat apart, except for motorcycle taxis and those expressly provided by the IATF-EID or the DOTr;
- iv. Private and public utility vehicles shall only accommodate passengers in accordance with the maximum capacity approved by the DOTr. Drivers and operators that exceed the allowed capacity shall be apprehended and their vehicles towed;

- v. Drivers and operators of PUVs and employee shuttle service vehicles must provide alcohol or hand sanitizers inside their vehicles;
- vi. All drivers and operators must conduct disinfection of their vehicles thoroughly before and after each use;
- vii. All PUV and employee shuttle service terminal operators must ensure that queueing passengers strictly observe social distancing, by requiring passengers to maintain a distance of at least one (1) meter from the next passenger;
- viii. The terminal operator shall check the body temperature of all passengers before providing the service. In case the body temperature is above 37.5°C, the passenger shall not be allowed to ride the vehicle and asked to return home;
- ix. Eating inside PUVs and employee shuttle services are strictly prohibited. Talking, and making or taking phone calls are strongly discouraged;
- x. The terminal operator shall maintain a logbook of the names of the passengers, the time of their departure, as well as the vehicle code or plate number of the PUV the passenger rode. The record shall be submitted to the City Epidemiology and Disease Surveillance Unit (CEDSU), should the need arise;
- xi. In order to avoid crowding and impeding vehicular traffic, all PUVs and employee shuttle service vehicles shall have separate designated pick-up and drop-off points for their passengers. Picking up passengers at drop-off points, as well as dropping off passengers at designated pick-up points shall be strictly prohibited.
- xii. The implementation of contactless payment services and automated fare collection systems for all modes of public transportation is strongly recommended. All PUV and terminal operators are highly encouraged to implement their own contactless payment systems for the benefit of all their passengers.

b. Tricycles

All tricycle drivers and operators in the City of Taguig shall adhere to the following guidelines:

- i. Tricycle operators and drivers shall only allow a maximum of one (1) passenger per travel who shall sit in

the sidecar provision. For back-to-back type tricycles, they shall be allowed to accommodate a maximum of two (2) passengers. No passenger shall be seated behind the driver. Violation of this particular provision may result in immediate impounding of the tricycle unit or cancellation of their franchise;

- ii. Tricycle operators and drivers are encouraged to install a transparent plastic covering or any form of non-permeable transparent barrier between the driver side and the side car;
- iii. Tricycle driver shall not charge more than the approved rates for one (1) passenger in accordance with the regulations of the TCTRB; and,
- iv. All tricycle operators and drivers who are allowed to operate shall observe the rules and regulations set by the Taguig City Transport Regulatory Board (TCTRB) of the City Government of Taguig.

c. Jeepneys, Buses and Modern PUVs

Traditional Public Utility Jeepneys (PUJs), buses and Modern PUVs shall be allowed to operate in the City of Taguig at fifty percent (50%) vehicle capacity excluding the driver and conductor, provided they comply with the guidelines of the Land Transportation Franchising and Regulatory Board (LTFRB) and the Land Transportation Office (LTO).

d. UV Express

UV Express vehicles shall be allowed to operate in the City of Taguig at a maximum of 2 passengers per row and the vehicle should not exceed the fifty percent (50%) of its capacity.

e. Taxis and TNVS

TNVS cars and taxi cabs are allowed to operate for only a maximum of two (2) passengers per row and one (1) passenger on the driver's row.

f. Motorcycle Taxis

In accordance with IATF Resolution No. 80, Series of 2020 on the resumption of operations of motorcycle taxis, motorcycle taxis shall be allowed to operate but shall only be for those considered as APORs. All informal and illegal MC Taxi services or "habal-habal" are strictly prohibited.

g. Free Transport for Medical Frontliners

The Libreng Sakay program for all medical frontliners shall continue to operate considering the reduction of capacity of PUVs, subject to strict implementation of minimum health protocols in all shuttles to be used.

h. Use of Motorcycles, Bicycles, including Electronic Bikes

- i. Individuals reporting to work, or those allowed to go out of their homes to purchase essential supplies and/or goods shall be allowed to use motorcycles and bicycles, including e-Bikes, as their means of transportation;
- ii. Individuals reporting to work must bring any valid government issued ID as indicating their place of work or residence;
- iii. Back riders are allowed without barriers provided they belong to the same household;
- iv. In addition to face masks, all drivers or riders must wear helmets and other protective gear.

i. Private Shuttle Services

In addition to the minimum health and safety protocols, the following must be observed:

- i. Employers classified as large and medium-sized private establishments (i.e. those with total assets above PHP15M) are enjoined to provide shuttle services to their employees;
- ii. The maximum capacity of shuttle services for employees shall be to those of PUVs depending on the type of vehicle used. All vehicle types, as long as not expressly prohibited by the DOTr through an issuance, may be used for shuttle services;
- iii. Adequate ventilation must be ensured at all times by the opening of windows of at least three (3) inches while in transit and should be practiced whenever possible;

12.CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

In accordance with Department Order Nos. 30 and 33 of the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), the following rules for Construction Projects shall apply:

- a. All public and private construction projects are allowed to continue, including minor renovations and fit-outs;
- b. All construction sites must have a Designated Safety Officer (DSO) who shall be in charge of:
 - i. Reporting suspect, probable and confirmed COVID-19 cases to the COVID-19 Hotline; and,
 - ii. Compliance with the Construction Safety Guidelines in Safe City Task Force Advisory No. 10.

13. MALLS AND EATING ESTABLISHMENTS

In accordance with the IATF Omnibus Guidelines, in relation to the Negative List of Business Establishments and Activities in Annex "A" of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Memorandum Circular No. 21-28, the following guidelines during the MECQ shall apply:

- a. Operations of malls and shopping centers shall be allowed at fifty percent (50%) capacity;
- b. All retail stores and other service centers or providers in malls and shopping centers shall be allowed to operate at fifty percent (50%) capacity, except for those establishments listed as offering services or goods not allowed at this time in Sec. 3(5) of the IATF Omnibus Guidelines, as amended last 19 August;
- c. All restaurants and other eating establishments, including those located inside malls and shopping centers, shall be allowed to operate for take-out and delivery services only. Dine-in, even in *al fresco* or outdoor areas, is strictly prohibited during the MECQ period.
- d. All food establishments, including those that operate 24/7, may offer take-out and delivery services at their normal operating hours. They are allowed to offer delivery services even during curfew hours, but may only provide take-out service for customers considered as essential workers or APORs;
- e. Vulnerable individuals, including those below eighteen (18) years old, above sixty five (65) years old, pregnant women, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidities or other health risks, are not allowed to enter malls, shopping centers, and restaurants or other eating establishments, except when indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services, or for work in establishments located therein.

Any person in violation of these guidelines shall be penalized in accordance with Republic Act No. 11332, otherwise known as the “*Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act*” in relation to Presidential Proclamation No. 922, Taguig City Ordinance No. 24, Series of 2020, otherwise known as the “*New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City*” and other applicable laws and ordinances. This will be without prejudice to the filing of an administrative case if the violator is a government official or employee.

The implementation of the guidelines provided above shall be closely and regularly monitored. These guidelines are subject to change, in accordance with the evaluation of the Safe City Task Force and the issuances of the IATF-EID, and other relevant national government agencies and offices.

Annex "A"

GENERAL GUIDELINES APPLICABLE TO DIFFERENT LEVELS OF COMMUNITY QUARANTINE FOR THE CITY OF TAGUIG

1. Minimum health standards shall be complied with at all times
 - All sectors shall abide by the minimum health standards prescribed by the DOH in Administrative Order No. 2020-0015, as well as sector-relevant guidelines issued by the national government, its offices and attached agencies, as well as the guidelines issued by the City.
2. Movement of cargo shall be unhampered
 - The movement of cargo/delivery vehicles as well as vehicles used by public utility companies, shuttle services of permitted establishments shall not be subject to ID systems but shall maintain compliance with minimum health standards.
3. LGUs to enforce curfew only for **non-workers** and to penalize, in a fair and humane manner, violations of the restrictions on the movement of people.
 - ***Section 10 of Taguig City Ordinance No. 24, Series of 2020, otherwise known as the "New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City,"*** is enforced imposing a city-wide regulation on dispensable travels and mobility within the City of Taguig against the spread of COVID-19.
 - Dispensable travels and mobility for non-workers shall be restricted from **"8:00P.M. to 4:00A.M."**
4. All persons are mandated to wear **face masks**, ear loop masks, indigenous, reusable, do-it-yourself masks, or face shields, handkerchiefs, bandanas, N95 masks, and **full face shields** or such other protective equipment or any combination thereof, that can be worn over both the nose and mouth which can effectively lessen the transmission of COVID-19.
 - These masks and shields must be worn whenever they go out of their residences for any purpose including travel to work, purchase of basic necessities, attending to medical or emergency reasons, or as part of one's work.
 - These masks must be worn at all times and may not be removed.



- These face shields must cover the entire face and should extend to the ears and below the chin. Thus, visor type face shields are not allowed.

5. Acts of discrimination inflicted upon healthcare workers, repatriated OFWs and non-OFWs, COVID-19 cases, whether confirmed, recovered, or undergoing treatment, as well as suspect and probable cases, and PUM are denounced in the strongest terms.

- Acts in furtherance of discrimination such as, but not limited to, coercion, libel, slander, physical injuries, and dishonor of contractual obligations, such as contracts of lease or employment, shall be dealt with criminally, civilly, and/or administratively.
- ***Punishable under Section 17 of the New Normal Ordinance of Taguig City.***

6. All Malls are required to observe the minimum health standards laid out by the National Government and Local Government
